1 BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 In the Matter of the STIPULATION OF FACTS AND 4 Educator License of) FINAL ORDER OF SUSPENSION 5 ALICIA M ATHERTON) AND PROBATION 6 7 On December 13, 2017, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 8 (Commission) received a report from the Willamina School District (WSD) indicating 9 Alicia M. Atherton (Atherton) may have committed an act of gross neglect of duty and/or 10 gross unfitness, in connection with unprofessional conduct while appearing / working 11 after hours at her work site. 12 After review of the matters alleged, Atherton and the Commission agree that their 13 respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to 14 certain facts, the imposition of a three (3) month suspension followed by a period of 15 probation. 16 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 17 sanction to be imposed. Atherton stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in 18 the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law 19 set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Atherton waives the right to a hearing 20 to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. 21 By signing below, Atherton acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to 22 the following: (i) she has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to 23 contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and 24 finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this 25 Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Suspension and Probation (Stipulation and Final 26 Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the 27 public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is 28 contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the 29 Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither 30 Atherton nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) she has fully read this 31 Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) she voluntarily, without 32 any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance 33 and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) she states that no promise or

34 35 representation has been made to induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and

(vii) she has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and



has been fully advised with regard to her rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

- The Commission has licensed Atherton since July 12, 2001. Atherton's Initial II
 Teaching License, with endorsements in ESOL (ML/HS, ECE/ELE) and Multiple
 Subjects Self-Contained (ECE, ELE), is valid from May 4, 2015 through May 3,
 2018. On May 3, 2018, Atherton made timely application for renewal, and the
 expiration of Atherton's license was pended awaiting the results from the
 Commission's investigation. During all relevant times, Atherton was employed by
 the WSD.
- 2. On December 13, 2017, the Commission received information from the WSD indicating Atherton may have committed acts which constitute gross neglect of duty. The district reported that on multiple occasions during the month of December 2017, Atherton reported, after hours, to her worksite and engaged in unprofessional conduct that violated district policies.
- 3. Investigation determined that during the month of December 2017, Atherton repeatedly appeared on school grounds afterhours. Surveillance video showed Atherton entering and exiting the school at various dates and times ranging from 7:30 pm to 3:00 am. Atherton explained during an interview that she came to the school afterhours in an endeavor to be a good teacher (perform work) and because things at home were not good. While Atherton was on school grounds afterhours, Atherton engaged in a variety of inappropriate behaviors including consumption of alcohol on school premises, and other inappropriate conduct that violated district policy. At one point during the district investigation. Atherton elected to resign her employment in lieu of termination.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(b) (Substantial unauthorized use of employment time or school resources for private purposes). Furthermore, the conduct described in section two (2) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(2)(e) (Not use the district's or school's name, property, or resources for non-educational benefit or purposes without approval of the educator's supervisor or the appointing authority); and OAR 584-020-0035(3)(a) (Maintain the dignity of the profession by respecting and obeying the law, exemplifying personal integrity and honesty).

The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.

ORDER

The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a three (3) month suspension upon Atherton's Oregon educator license as follows:

Alicia Atherton's Oregon educator license is hereby suspended for three (3) month following the adoption of this order.

Furthermore, the Commission imposes a three (3) year period of probation upon Atherton to commence upon reinstatement of her Oregon educator license and subject to the following terms and conditions of probation:

- Atherton shall submit semiannual progress reports to the commission for the first two years of her probation period from a mental health professional indicating continued counseling at a level recommended by the provider. Treatment prior to the execution of this Stipulation will be credited toward this requirement.
- Atherton shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.

2	Violation of any term or condition of probation shall constitute an independent basis for
3	the Commission to revoke Atherton's Oregon educator license or otherwise impose
4	discipline, after first providing Atherton with notice and opportunity for hearing
