6	On February 9, 2017, the T	eacher Standard	ls and Practices Commission (Commission) received
7	a report from the Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) alleging that David Springer		
8	(Springer) had violated Professional Standards and Practices.		
9	After review of the matters alleged, Springer and the Commission agree that their respective		
10	interests, together with the public	interest, are bes	st served by a stipulation to certain facts and the
11	imposition of a sixty (60) day susp	ension of Sprin	ger's Oregon educator license.
12	This document sets forth t	he facts upon w	hich the parties have agreed and the stipulated
13	sanction to be imposed. Springer	stipulates that t	here is sufficient evidence in the Commission's files
14	and records to support the finding	gs of fact, conclu	isions of law, and order set forth below.

Springer holds an Initial 5 II Teaching License, with an endorsement in Multiple Subjects Self-Contained (ECE, ELE), valid 6 from November 9, 2013, through December 23, 2016. On November 4, 2016, Springer made 7 timely application for renewal of his license. Due to Springer's active investigation, his license 8 expiration was suspended (remained valid), pending the outcome of the investigation. During all 9 relevant times, Springer was employed by the Portland Public Schools (PPS), providing long term 10 substitute services at Beach Elementary School. 11 2) On February 9, 2017, the Commission received a report from the Oregon Department of Human 12 Services (DHS), advising that DHS received an abuse report alleging that Springer had injured a 13 student on February 7, 2017. Furthermore, information received indicates that Springer was 14 previously reported to school officials for similar conduct dating back to November 13, 2016. 15 Investigation determined the following: 16 a) On November 13, 2016, student NV was talking in class and distracting other students. When 17 she failed to comply with Springer's verbal redirection, Springer spun and / or moved the 18 empty chair she had been sitting in. In the process of returning to her moved chair, NV fell to 19 the floor, landing hard on her bottom and striking her head. As a result, NV was injured and 20 crying. Springer sent NV to the nurse accompanied by another student where she complained 21 of dizziness and head pain. A student teacher was in the room and testified that Springer's 22 conduct resulted in NV's injury. Springer was provided specific expectations by school 23 administrators not to move students by force and not to redirect students with his hands or by 24 25 touching. b) On February 7, 2017, DC, an eight year old student in Springer's classroom was not complying 26 with Springer's verbal attempts to redirect him from distracting other students. 1	around in his chair to face the rest of the class and was talking to other students. In an attempt		
2	to get DC's attention, Springer lifted DC's desk while he was turned around distracting another		
3	student. The desk reportedly struck DC in the back causing him pain. Springer reported that h		
4	only lifted and dropped the desk to make a loud noise and get DC's attention. Student		
5	witnesses stated that DC was struck by the desk Springer moved. DC was seen by the school		
6	nurse, who reported there was no visible injury. DC complained to the school nurse that there		
7	was pain and tenderness in his back.		
8	c) As a result of Springer's conduct on February 7, 2017, school administrators and Springer		
9	agreed that he leave the building and he was removed from the PPS substitute list for the		
10	remainder of the school year. Springer's conduct was subsequently reported to DHS and law		
11	enforcement. Law enforcement found no grounds for any criminal charges.

20	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW		
21	David Springer's conduct described in sections two (2) (a), (b), (c), above constitutes gross		
22	neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR		
23	584-020-0010(1) (Recognize the worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual),		
24	OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(a) (Establishing and		
25	maintaining classroom management that is conducive to learning), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e)		
26	(Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(d)		
27	(Unreasonable physical force against students, fellow employees, or visitors to the school, except a		
28	permitted under ORS 339.250).		

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1	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS		
2	342.175.		
3			
4	ORDER		
5	The Commission hereby adopts and incorporates herein the above stipulation of facts,		
6	conclusions of law, and based thereon hereby imposes a sixty (60) day suspension of Springer's		
7	Oregon educator license following the adoption of this order.		
8	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a period of one (1) year of probation upon Springer's		
9	licensure to commence from the date of any reinstatement of licensure and subject to the following		
10	conditions:		
11	1. Springer shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of Oregon		
12	Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.		
13	2. Springer will successfully complete a Commission approved training related to Classroom		
14	Management within one year of the signing of this order.
