	On March 23, 2017, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission
8	(Commission) received a report from the Cascade School District (CSD) indicating Becky
9	A. Glodt (Glodt) may have committed an act of gross neglect of duty and/or gross
10	unfitness. Specifically, that Glodt inappropriately interacted with a student by throwing
11	school supplies at a student, thereby jeopardizing the student's safety.
12	After review of the matters alleged, Glodt and the Commission agree that their
13	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to
14	certain facts, the imposition of a public reprimand, and a three (3) year period of
15	probation.
16	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the
17	sanction to be imposed. Glodt stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the
18	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set
19	forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Glodt waives the right to a hearing to
20	contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.
21	By signing below, Glodt acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the
22	following: (i) she has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to contest
23	the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally
24	waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of
25	Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order);
26	(ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public
27	upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent
28	upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does
29	not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Glodt nor the
30	Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) she has fully read this Stipulation and
31	Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) she voluntarily, without any force or
32	duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of
33	the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) she states that no promise or representation has
34	been made to induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) she has
35	consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully

advised with regard to her rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

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## STIPULATION OF FACTS

1. The Commission has licensed Glodt since January 23, 2006. Glodt's Initial II Teaching License, with endorsements in Basic Mathematics (HS, ML); Biology (HS, ML); Integrated Science (HS, ML); and Multiple Subjects (MIDLVL), is valid from January 27, 2015 through February 27, 2018. On January 2, 2018, Glodt made timely application for renewal. The expiration of Glodt's license was stayed and her application pended until the Commission investigation is resolved. During all relevant times, Glodt was employed by the Cascade School District (CSD) at the Cascade Junior High School (CJHS).

 2. On March 23, 2017, the Commission received a report from CSD, advising that Glodt may have violated professional standards when Glodt inappropriately interacted with a student by throwing school supplies. Investigation determined the following:

a. On February 28, 2017, student JL asked if he could borrow a pencil. Glodt responded, "You want to borrow a pencil?" Glodt then began throwing various objects towards JL. Objects thrown include the following: an eraser, a glue stick, a rubber band, a pad of sticky notes, and a pair of student scissors. JL stated that when he saw Glodt reach for the student scissors, he picked up a book and placed it in front of his face for protection, and the student scissors struck the book. Glodt's conduct was witnessed by other students and an instructional assistant in the classroom.

b. When interviewed by a district administrator, Glodt admitted to the conduct. Glodt stated that she was seriously ill at the time of the incident, and had been frustrated with JL. Glodt acknowledged that throwing objects at a student was not appropriate classroom management. Glodt apologized to JL for her conduct. CSD found Glodt's conduct violated

1	district policies and issued Glodt a Letter of Final Warning and a day off
2	without pay.

13	CONCLUSION OF LAW
14	The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS
15	342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1)
16	(Recognize the worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual), OAR
17	584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(a) (Establishing
18	and maintaining classroom management that is conducive to learning), OAR 584-020-
19	0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations); and OAR 584-
20	020-0030(2)(b)(Skill in communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents,
21	and other patrons).
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23	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
24	ORS 342.175.
25	ORDER
26	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
27	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a public reprimand upon Becky Glodt's
28	Oregon educator license.
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30	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a period of three (3) years of probation
31	upon Glodt's Oregon educator license to commence upon reinstatement and subject to
32	the following terms and conditions of probation:

- 1. Glodt shall successfully complete a Commission approved training related to classroom management within the first year of probation. (Completed on April 1 and 8, 2019)
- 2. Glodt shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of
