| 34   | FINDINGS OF FACT   |          |
| 35   | 1. Bryan Bates has been licensed by the Commission since December 18, 2016. Bate   | es'      |
| 36   | Preliminary Teaching License, with an endorsement in Music (PK-12), is valid from  | m        |
| 37   | December 1, 2017 through June 21, 2021. During all relevant times Bates was  |          |
| 38   | employed by the Ione School District (ISD).  |          |

- 2. On January 29, 2018, the Commission received a report from the ISD advising that 2 Bates, a teacher employed with the ISD, were under criminal investigation for possible sex abuse related to a student. Investigation determined that Bates had subjected a minor aged female student to sexual contact by touching her breast and having her touch Bates' crotch area on multiple occasions. Bates also communicated 5 inappropriately via text messages with the same student. Bates' misconduct took 6 place on school grounds. Bates was subsequently arrested and charged with Sex 7 8 Abuse III (2 counts), Official Misconduct 1, (1 count) and Harassment (two counts).
  - 3. On September 27, 2018, Bates plead guilty to and was convicted of one count of ORS 163.415, Sexual Abuse in the Third Degree, a Class A misdemeanor. The remaining criminal charges were dismissed by plea agreement. Bates was sentenced to 180 days in jail, followed by two years' probation, including the requirement that Bates register as a sex offender, fines and community service.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Bryan Bates' criminal convictions as described in section three (3) above, constitute gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment); and OAR 584-020-0040(1) (The Commission will deny, revoke or deny the right to apply for a license or charter school registration to any applicant or educator who, has been convicted of any of the crimes listed in ORS 342.143, or the substantial equivalent of any of those crimes if convicted in another jurisdiction, or convicted of attempt to commit such crimes as defined in ORS 161.405), including ORS 163.415 -Sexual Abuse in the Third Degree. This conduct also constitutes gross unfitness in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(c) (Conviction of violating any federal, state, or local law. A conviction includes any final judgment of conviction by a court whether as the result of guilty plea, no contest plea or any other means); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(d) (Commission of an act listed in OAR 584-020-0040(1); and OAR 584-020-0040(5)(e) (Admission of or engaging in acts constituting criminal conduct, even in the absence of a conviction).
