SEQUERIA REPRIMAND 7 In November 2018, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) internally referred licensed educator Carlos Sequeria (Sequeria), to the 8 9 Professional Practices Division when they determined that Sequeria appeared to be in violation of professional standards, specifically working under an expired license. 10 After review of the matters alleged, Sequeria and the Commission agree that their 11 respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to 12 13 certain facts and the imposition of a Public Reprimand. 14 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 15 sanction to be imposed. Sequeria stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law 16 17 set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Sequeria waives the right to a hearing 18 to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. 19 By signing below, Sequeria acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to 20 the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest 21 the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally 22 waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of 23 Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this 24 Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and 25 26 subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not 27 approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Sequeria nor the 28 Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and 29 Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or 30 duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has 31

been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has

1 attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of 2 the Stipulated Final Order below. 3 STIPULATION OF FACTS 4 1. The Commission has licensed Sequeria since September 14, 1992. Sequeria 5 currently holds a Professional Administrator License, with an endorsement in 6 Administrator (PK-12), valid November 26, 2018, through November 11, 2023. 7 During all relevant times, Sequeria was employed by Lane Education Service 8 District (LESD). 9 10 2. In November 2018, Commission licensure staff referred Sequeria to Professional 11 Practices after determining Sequeria may have inappropriately performed the 12 duties of an administrator without an appropriate, valid, license or registration. 13 Investigation determined that on August 31, 2017, the Commission sent Sequeria 14 a reminder that his license was due to expire in November. This reminder was 15 sent to the contact information on file with the Commission at that time. 16 Sequeria did not make application for renewal, and on November 11, 2017, 17 Sequeria's continuing Administrator license expired. 18 19 On September 13, 2018, Sequeria realized he had not made application for 20 renewal and that Sequeria's license was expired. Sequeria contacted commission 21 staff to address this issue. It was learned that Sequeria had continued to perform 22 the duties of an administrator, which requires a valid license, for approximately 23 one year without a valid license. Furthermore, it was learned that Sequeria had 24 failed to update his contact information (address and email) with the 25 Commission. Sequeria promptly made application and updated his contact 26 information to ensure Sequeria would receive any notifications from the 27 Commission in the future. Sequeria's license was issued / renewed on November 28 26, 2018. Records indicate that Sequeria has not had any previous issues related 29 to him maintaining his licensure. 30 IT IS SO STIPULATED 3/5/2020 Date 3/6/2020 31 32 os Segueria 33 34

5	professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0040(4)(r) (Working without a license); and
6	OAR 584-050-0035 (1) (Any person employed in a position in a school district,
7	education service district, or charter school for which a license or registration is
8	required pursuant to ORS Chapter 342, must hold a valid license or registration
9	appropriate for the assignment while working as a public school, education service
10	district or charter school employee).
11	
12	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
13	ORS 342.175.
14	ORDER
15	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
16	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand on Carlos Sequeria's
17	Oregon educator license.
