6	On May 20, 1998, the Teacher Standards and Practices
7	Commission (Commission) issued of Notice of Opportunity for
8	hearing to Susan Lynne Willard in which the Commission proposed
9	to suspend or revoke Ms. Willard's Oregon teaching license or to
10	impose other discipline under ORS 342.177. Thereafter Ms.
11	Willard requested a hearing through her attorney, Elizabeth
12	McKanna. The Commission and Ms. Willard have now reviewed the
13	issues connected with this proceeding and have determined that
14	their respective interests and the public interest are best
15	served by a stipulation to certain facts and a suspension of Ms.
16	Willard's Oregon teaching license. In entering this stipulation,
17	Ms. Willard waives her rights to a hearing and understands that
18	the Commission will impose a sanction that includes suspension of
19	her teaching license for a period through May 15, 1999.
20	FINDINGS OF FACTS
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22	Ms. Willard and the Commission stipulate as follows:
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25	endorsements in elementary education and reading.
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1 2. Ms. Willard was employed as a teacher with the South 2 Umpqua School District from September 1987 until June 3 10, 1998, when she resigned her position with the 4 district.

> 3. Early in her tenure with the South Umpqua School District, Ms. Willard began working as a volunteer with the Canyonville Parent Group, an organization that raises money and provides support to the Canyonville Elementary School. During the period prior to January 1998, Ms. Willard served as treasurer to the organization.

4. Between December 1995 and January 1998, Ms. Willard converted funds belonging to the Canyonville Parent Group without the knowledge of the organization, and she used the funds for personal purposes.

5. In January of 1998, members of the Canyonville Parent Group learned of a shortage of funds in the organization's account, and they brought the matter to the attention of the school district. At that time, Ms. Willard acknowledged that she had misused the funds.

On February 25, 1998, Ms. Willard entered into a 6. repayment agreement with the Canyonville Parent Group in which she agreed to repay the sum of \$2,856.85 according to a scheduled payment arrangement.

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STIPULATION AND ORDER OF SUSPENSION

Since that time, Ms. Willard has made timely payments 1 2 as required under the repayment agreement. 7. In February 1998, Ms. Willard entered a counseling 3 program with Kristin Bezdek, M.S., Mental Health 4 Specialist with the Douglas County Mental Health 5 Department. Ms. Bezdek submitted a report to the 6 Commission indicating that Ms. Willard has had a 7 compulsive gambling disorder secondary to a diagnosis 8 of depression. Ms. Bezdek stated that Ms. Willard's 9 conversion of the funds was directly related to her 10 compulsive gambling disorder. Ms. Bezdek further 11 reported that Ms. Willard has abstained from gambling 12 activities and has made good progress in her counseling 13 program. 14 During her employment with South Umpqua School 8. 15 District, Ms. Willard received favorable evaluations, 16 and she had not previously been the subject of any 17 complaint or disciplinary proceeding before the 18 19 Commission. 111 20 21 /// 111 22 111 23 /// 24 25

the full Commission. If the Commission does not approve the 2 stipulation, the matter will be returned to the Commission for 3 further action, and neither Ms. Willard nor the Commission shall 4 be bound by any statements contained herein. S 11/5/98

CONCLUSION OF LAW 12

Ms. Willard converted funds to her own use belonging to the 13 Canyonville Parent Organization in violation of OAR 584-020-

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0040(4)(b). 15

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16 DISCUSSION 17

Ms. Willard's conduct involved dishonesty directly related 18

to her professional responsibilities. Accordingly, the 19

Commission considers this matter a serious violation of 20

professional standards, requiring suspension of Ms. Willard's 21

teaching license for a period of approximately six months. 22

selecting a sanction, the Commission take into account the 23

following mitigating circumstances: (1) Ms. Willard has a 24

favorable teaching record of approximately eleven years; (2) Ms. 25

Willard has agreed to make restitution for the misappropriated 26

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1 funds and has already repaid most of the funds; and (3) Ms.

2 Willard's misconduct was due at least in part to a compulsive

3 gambling problem for which she has received treatment and has

4 made considerable progress.

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6 ORDER

7 The Oregon teaching license of Susan Lynne Willard shall be

8 suspended for a period commencing with the date of this order

9 through May 15, 1999. Upon expiration of the period of

10 suspension, Ms. Willard's license shall be reinstated, upon

11 application and payment of the reinstatement fee, and if she has

12 complied with Commission standards under OAR 584 Division 020,

13 has abstained from all gambling activities and has complied with

14 the terms of the repayment agreement with the Canyonville Parent

15 Group dated February 25, 1998.

Upon reinstatement of her license, Ms. Willard shall be

17 placed on probation for a period of one year subject to the

18 conditions that she comply with all standards for competent and

19 ethical performance of Oregon educators under OAR 584. Division

20 020, that she abstain from all gambling activities and that she

21 comply with the repayment agreement dated February 25, 1998.

22 Failure to comply with any condition of probation shall

23 constitute a basis alone for disciplinary action, up to and
