345	In the Matter of the Teaching License of ERVIN L. LATINCSICS Case No. 113198 STIPULATION AND ORDER OF SUSPENSION			
6	The Teacher Standards and Practices (Commission) issued a Notice of Denial of			
7	Teaching License and Opportunity for Hearing on August 27, 2003, to Ervin L. Latincsics. Mr.			
8	Latincsics requested a hearing, and the case was assigned to an Administrative Law Judge and			
9	scheduled for hearing on July 21, 2004.			
10	After a review of the matters alleged, the Commission and Mr. Latincsics have agreed			
11	that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to			
12	certain facts and the suspension of Mr. Latincsics' right to apply for a teaching license, followed			
13	by a period of probation.			
14	Mr. Latincsics continues to deny many of the allegations in the Notice, including the			
15	allegations that he mishandled school funds or that he used booster club funds for his personal			
16	purposes. However, Mr. Latincsics stipulates that there is sufficient evidence contained in the			
17	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth			
18	below, and Mr. Latinesics understands and consents that the Commission will make the findings			
19	of fact and conclusions of law set forth in this order.			
2021	In entering into this stipulation, Mr. Latinesics waives his right to a hearing and			
22	understands that the Commission will deny his application for a license and suspend his right to apply for a license for a period of 9 months. This stipulation and proposed order are contingent			
23	on approval by the full Commission. If the Commission does not approve this stipulation and			

order, it is understood that any waiver of rights by Mr. Latinesics is therefore revoked. It is 1 further understood that the statements contained in this stipulation may not be used by either the Commission or Mr. Latinesics for any reason if the Commission fails to approve the stipulation 3 and proposed order. 4 5 It is so stipulated: 6/24/04 Date 7-12-04 6 7 Ervin L. Latinesics 8 Victoria Chamberlain, Executive D Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 10 11 FINDINGS OF FACTS Mr. Latinesics held an Oregon Reciprocal Teaching License from September 1. 1997 to September 1999. That license has expired. 14 Mr. Latincsics has also held a teaching certificate in the State of Washington. He 15 2. was employed as a teacher for the Battle Ground School District from September 1996 to 16 September 1997. He worked as a teacher for the Ridgefield School District in Ridgefield, 17 Washington from September 1999 to August 2001, and he was employed as head coach of the 18 19 high school wrestling team between 1995 to January 2002. On April 16, 2003, Mr. Latinesics entered a plea of guilty in Clark County 20 3. Superior Court to the crime of Injury to a Public Record. On that day the court sentenced Mr. 21 Latinesics to 30 days in jail, with one day credit for time served and 29 days of community 22 service in lieu of jail time. The court also ordered Mr. Latincsics to pay \$1870 in fines, victim's 23

- assessment and court fees and \$2250 as restitution to the Ridgefield School District. In addition, the court required Mr. Latinesics to undergo evaluation for gambling addiction and to participate in a treatment program for gambling addiction if recommended.
- 4. On December 15, 2003, the Superintendent for Public Instruction in Washington suspended Mr. Latincsics' Washington Teaching Certificate for a period of 60 days based on Latincsics' failure to properly manage wrestling team funds and his conviction for the crime of Injury to a Public Record.
 - 5. During the course of his employment as wrestling coach, Mr. Latincsics coordinated the formation of the Ridgefield Wrestling Club. The club served as a booster organization for the wrestling team and engaged in fund-raising activities in support of the team.
 - 6. During the fall of 2001, the wrestling club and the high school sold wrestling cards as a fund-raising activity involving the sale of wrestling cards. Mr. Latincsics altered documents and mismanaged funds related to this activity.
- 7. During the period between April 2001 and December 2001, Mr. Latincsics wrote checks using the wrestling club checking account and charged money on a credit card of the wrestling club for Mr. Latincsics' personal purposes.
- 8. On March 2, 2003, Mr. Latincsics applied for an Oregon Teaching License. On the application, he answered "no" to the question, "Have you ever left any educational or school-related employment, voluntarily or involuntarily, while the subject of an inquiry, review or investigation of alleged misconduct?" In fact, Mr. Latincsics resigned his position as coach of the Ridgefield High School wrestling team in January 2002 while he was the subject of an investigation by the school district.

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1	9. On the March 2, 2003 application for an Oregon Teaching License, Mr. Latincsics			
2	answered "no" to the question, "Have you ever been arrested or cited for any offense * * * which			
3	is still pending in the court." In fact, Mr. Latincsics had been charged with a crime and these			
4	charges were pending before the Clark County Superior Court at the time of Mr. Latincsics'			
5	application.			
6	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW			
7	1. Mr. Latincsics altered documents and mismanaged funds related to the sale of			
8	wrestling cards on behalf of the Ridgefield High School wrestling team. This conduct			
9	constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of OAR 584-020-0040(4)(b) and (c).			
10	2. Mr. Latincsics used funds belonging to the high school wrestling club for his			
11	personal purposes. This conduct constitutes gross unfitness in violation of OAR 584-020-			
12	0040(5)(b).			
13	3. Mr. Latincsics was convicted of the crime of Injury to a Public Record. This			
14	constitutes gross unfitness in violation of OAR 584-020-0040(5)(c).			
15	4. Mr. Latincsics made a knowing misrepresentation on his application for a			
16	teaching license when he denied that he had left school-related employment while the subject of			
17	an investigation. This conduct constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of OAR 584-020-			
18	0040(4)(c).			
19	5. Mr. Latinesics made a knowing misrepresentation on his application for a			
20	teaching license when he denied that he had been arrested for a crime that was pending before a			
21	court. This conduct constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of OAR 584-020-0040(4)(c).			
22	ORDER

1. The Commission denies the application of Ervin L. Latincsics for an Oregon
Teaching License and suspends the right of Mr. Latincsics to apply for a license for a period of 9
months from the date of this order. Upon expiration of the period of suspension, Mr. Latincsics
may apply for issuance of a license as provided under OAR 584-050-0015. The license license
shall be issued if Mr. Latincsics meets the following conditions:

a. He shall, at his own expense, undergo an evaluation by a mental health
professional who is acceptable to the Commission. Mr. Latincsics shall provide a copy of this

order to the evaluator and any other materials the evaluator deems appropriate. The evaluator shall submit a report directly to the Commission. The report shall contain the following: (i) a statement that in the professional opinion of the evaluator, Mr. Latincsics is fit to work as a teacher and there is a high probability that Mr. Latincsics will not mishandle funds or engage in other dishonest or unprofessional conduct in the future; (ii) a description of the processes, testing and techniques used in the evaluation; (iii) an explanation of the basis for the evaluator's findings; (iv) whether there is any underlying physical or mental condition that would prevent Mr. Latincsics from meeting his professional responsibilities; and (v) a recommendation as to whether Mr. Latincsics should participate in continuing treatment.

b. The Commission considers the evaluator's report to be a medical record containing personal information the disclosure of which would constitute an unreasonable invasion of privacy. The Commission shall not disclose the report unless ordered to do so under Oregon law.

On issuance of the teaching license, Mr. Latincsics shall be placed on probation to the Commission for a period of four years, subject to the following conditions:

1	1.	Mr. Latincsics shall participate in continued treatment or counseling as
2	recommended	d by the evaluator.
3	2.	Mr. Latinesics shall not accept a school-related position that requires him to
4	handle funds	of a school or of any sponsoring organization of a school.
5	3.	Mr. Latinesics shall comply with all Standards for Competent and Ethical
6	Performance	under OAR 584 Division 020.
7	Viola	tion of any condition of probation may constitute an independent basis for the
8	Commission	to impose discipline, up to and including revocation of Mr. Latincsics' Oregon
9	Teaching Lic	ense, subject to his right to a hearing on the issue of whether he violated probation
