9	Simmons' request to reinstate his right to apply for an Oregon educator license that was	
10	evoked by default order on October 22, 2013. Jeffrey Simmons is eligible for reinstatement	
11	under the Commission's rules. Simmons appeared before the Commission unrepresented by	
12	counsel.	
13	Jeffrey Simmons has complied with all conditions for reinstatement required by	y the
14	Commission. After reviewing the evidence submitted by Simmons along with his personal	onal
15	statement to the Commission, the Commission grants the reinstatement of Jeffrey Simmons'	
16	right to apply for any Oregon educator license he may be eligible for, and issue Simmons a	
17	license based on a complete application received on July 31, 2018.	
18	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a four (4) year period of probation upo	n
19	Simmons to commence upon reinstatement of his right to apply for an Oregon educator license	
20	issuance of Simmons's teaching license, and subject to the following terms and conditions of	
21	probation:	
22	1. Simmons shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performa	ance of
23	Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division C)20.
24	2. Simmons will successfully complete two graduate level courses related to Cult	tural
25	Competency, Diversity and Inclusion, or other approved and related course work, withi	
26	the first year of probation. Course work must be preapproved by Commission	staff.

Violation of any term or condition of probation shall constitute an independent basis for the Commission to revoke Simmons' educator license or otherwise impose discipline, after first providing Simmons with notice and opportunity for hearing. Now therefore, the Commission orders that Jeffrey Simmons' right to apply for an Oregon educator's license is hereby reinstated effective November 2, 2018. 4 5 6 7 8	In the Matter of the Educator License of JEFFREY R SIMMONS DEFAULT ORDER OF REVOCATION OF RIGHT TO APPLY FOR AN EDUCATOR LICENSE
9	On June 28, 2013, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission)
10	issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Jeffrey R Simmons (Simmons) in which the
11	Commission charged him with Gross Neglect of Duty. The Notice was sent via U.S. First
12	Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail Receipt 7011 2000 0001 1282 3718 to the address on file
13	with the Commission. The Notice designated the Commission file as the record for purposes
14	of proving a prima facie case. The Certified Mail receipt was returned, signed to the
15	Commission on July 3, 2013. The regular mail was not returned to the Commission. The
16	Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated June 28, 2013, and signed by Victoria Chamberlain
17	Executive Director, stated:
18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	"IF A REQUEST FOR HEARING IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THIS 21-DAY PERIOD, YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING SHALL BE CONSIDERED WAIVED UNLESS YOUR FAILURE TO REQUEST A HEARING WAS BEYOND YOUR REASONABLE CONTROL. IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING OR IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR AT A HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF DEFAULT WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF YOUR LICENSE OR OTHER DISCIPLINE."
26	Simmons did not request a hearing. The Commission, therefore, finds Simmons to be in
27	default and enters the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and final order, based
28	on the files and records of the Commission concerning this matter.
29	FINDINGS OF FACT
30 31 32	 Jeffrey Simmons has been licensed since March 10, 2003. Simmons held an Initial I Teaching License issued April 14, 2009, with an endorsement in Music (ML/HS, ECE/ELE L), which expired on April 13, 2012. Simmons has not made application for
33 34	renewal. During all relevant times, Simmons was employed by the Bend-La Pine School District.
35	2. On March 2, 2012, the Commission received information from the Bend-La Pine
36	School District indicating Simmons may have committed acts which constitute gross
37	neglect of duty. A school district investigation into a November 2011, patron

complaint determined during the 2011 – 2012 school year, Simmons used racial and derogatory terms and nicknames when referring to several of his students. This included referring to a student of Asian descent as "Chopsticks", "Potsticker", "Cheap Chinese Labor", and calling her "Twinkie" because she was yellow on the outside and white on the inside. Simmons made demeaning comments about a student who was overweight and to another regarding his sexual orientation, referring to him as "Mrs. B." and suggesting he had a crush on a Justin Beiber. District investigation discovered several additional examples of Simmons' inappropriate behavior, including referring to an East-Indian student as a "towel head" and a "terrorist" and asking him if he was "going home to eat some curry". Other similar examples were documented in the Commission's investigation. These comments and references were witnessed and verified by multiple other students and at least one other adult. The involved students and those who witnessed Simmons' actions were all negatively affected by his actions, claiming they were hurt, intimidated, and afraid.

3. The Bend-La Pine School District provided Commission investigators with documents indicating that Simmons had been subjected to counseling and discipline regarding his inappropriate behavior with students dating back to the 2000 / 2001 school year. These documented incidents included Simmons using inappropriate language in class, picking on students, verbal abuse, being overly critical of students and singling them out. Other issues regarding Simmons' teaching were also documented, including Simmons' misuse of sick leave, failing to prepare for substitute teachers, failing to submit grades on time, and the mishandling of school finances, to name a few. The district attempted to correct Simmons' behavior by providing multiple "Letters of Direction", "Goal Setting" sessions, "Letters of Reprimand" and a "Program of Assistance" over a period of several years.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Simmons's conduct as described in section two (2) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1) (Recognize the worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual), OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(1)

1	(The competent educator is a person who understands students and is able to relate to
2	them in constructive and culturally competent ways. The competent educator establishes
3	and maintains good rapport), OAR 584-020-0030(2)(b) (Skill in communicating with
4	administrators, students, staff, parents, and other patrons); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0
5	as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries
6	with students in conduct and conversations at all times).
7	
8	Simmons's conduct as described in section three (3) above constitutes gross neglect
9	of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR
10	584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district
11	lawful and reasonable rules and regulations); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as it
12	incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(2)(c) (Strive for continued improvement and
13	professional growth).
14	
15	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS
16	342.175.
17	FINAL ORDER
18	The Commission hereby revokes Jeffrey R Simmons' Right to Apply for an Educator
19	license.
